



WHAT TO DO IF YOU WERE EXPOSED TO SOMEONE WHO HAS COVID-19

And, Your COVID-19 Vaccines ARE Up-to-Date

- IF YOU RECEIVED A BOOSTER DOSE OF ANY COVID-19 VACCINE. -OR-
- IF YOU COMPLETED THE PRIMARY SERIES* OF PFIZER OR MODERNA VACCINE LESS THAN FIVE MONTHS AGO. -OR-
- IF YOU COMPLETED THE PRIMARY SERIES* OF JOHNSON & JOHNSON VACCINE LESS THAN TWO MONTHS AGO.

10 DAYS



- Wear a mask around others for 10 days after your last exposure.
- Test on day five.
- If you develop symptoms or test positive, stay home.

IF YOU TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19 IN THE 90 DAYS BEFORE YOUR EXPOSURE

- Wear a mask around others for 10 days.
- If you develop symptoms, get tested and stay home.

And, You are Unvaccinated or Your Vaccines Are Not Up-to-Date

- IF YOU ARE UNVACCINATED OR ONLY RECEIVED ONE DOSE OF PFIZER OR MODERNA. -OR-
- IF YOU COMPLETED THE PRIMARY SERIES* OF PFIZER OR MODERNA VACCINE MORE THAN FIVE MONTHS AGO AND NO BOOSTER. -OR-
- IF YOU COMPLETED THE PRIMARY SERIES* OF JOHNSON & JOHNSON VACCINE MORE THAN TWO MONTHS AGO AND NO BOOSTER.

5 DAYS



- Stay home for five days after your last exposure, then wear a mask around others for the next five days.
- Test on day five.
- If you develop symptoms or test positive, stay home.

*A primary series consists of one dose of Johnson & Johnson vaccine; or two doses of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine; or three doses of Moderna or Pfizer vaccine if you received an additional dose because you are immunocompromised. Children who can't wear a mask should remain home for 10 full days following last day exposed, regardless of vaccine status.
